

Title 5 CCR § <u>55042</u> Course Repetition to Alleviate Substandard Academic Work

- (a) The district policies and procedures on course repetition adopted pursuant to section 55040 may permit a student to repeat a course in an effort to alleviate substandard academic work. ...
- (b) If a student repeats a course which is not designated as a repeatable course and receives a satisfactory grade, then he or she may not repeat the course again pursuant to this section and any further repetition of the course must be authorized by another provision of this division ... The first two substandard grades may be excluded in computing the student's GPA if the student repeats the class two or more times.

Title 5 CCR § <u>55046</u> Academic Renewal Without Course Repetition

- (a) The governing board of each community college district shall adopt and publish policies and procedures pertaining to the alleviation of previously recorded substandard academic work ...
- 1. The maximum amount of coursework that may be alleviated;
- 2. The amount of academic work to have been completed at a satisfactory level (minimum 2.00) subsequent to the coursework to be alleviated;
- 3. The length of time to have elapsed since the coursework to be alleviated was recorded;
- 4. A description of any specific courses and/or categories of courses that are, for any reason, exempt from consideration under the alleviation procedures;
- 5. The procedures to be followed by students in petitioning for alleviation; and
- 6. The personnel responsible for implementing the procedures.

ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION 4225

COURSE REPETITION AND REPEATABLE COURSES

I. COURSE REPETITION AND REPEATABILITY

A. Course Repetition to Alleviate Substandard Academic Work or After Withdrawal

A student may repeat a course in an effort to alleviate substandard (D, F, NP, and NC) academic work or after withdrawing (W, MW, or EW). Students may repeat a non-

II. REPETITION AND ACADEMIC RECORDS

When a course is repeated the District shall disregard the previous grade and credit and include only the most recent credit and grade in the student's grade point average.

A. Students may submit a petition to the Admissions and Records Office for any repeated course not automatically annotated or to reverse automated repetition not desired. All enrollments shall be recorded on the student's transcript using an appropriate annotation.

ACADEMIC RENEWAL

In order to qualify for Academic Renewal, students must complete the following requirements:

- 1. A petition must be filed in the Office of Admissions and Records. The Registrar or Dean of Enrollment Services is the designated authority for approval of academic renewal.
- 2. Accompanying the petition must be evidence that the previous substandard work does not reflect the student's current performance or capabilities.
- 3. Previous substandard work will be disregarded. Substandard grades are defined as "D," "F," "FW," or "NP."
- 4. No more than 30 units of coursework can be considered for academic renewal.
- 5. A period of at least two terms must have elapsed since the work to be alleviated was completed.
- 6. The student must have completed 18 units with a 2.00 GPA, 15 units with a 2.25 GPA or 12 units with a 2.5 GPA or higher in sessions subsequent to the substandard work. No units may be excluded for coursework that has previously been used to fulfill degree, certificate, or transfer certification requirements. Work from other accredited colleges will be considered for calculating their GPA.
- 7. When coursework is disregarded in the computation of the cumulative GPA, the student's academic record will be annotated; all coursework remains on record, ensuring a true and complete academic history. Academic renewal actions are irreversible.





Pilot: Personalized Email Message

The South Orange County Community College District (Irvine Valley College and Saddleback College) has two policies that you could utilize to <u>potentially</u> increase your college and/or transfer GPA:

- Course Repeat Annotation: for courses where you have repeated and have earned a better grade (A, B, or C), you could petition to have the previous attempts of the course be excluded from your GPA calculation.
- 2. Academic Renewal: you could petition to have up to 30 units of previous substandard coursework (D or F grades) be excluded from your GPA calculation.


Please note that in some cases, D grades may be counted towards the accumulation of 60 units to qualify for transferring to a CSU; counted to meet general education requirements for a CSU; and/or counted for associate degree requirements. Please consult a counselor to better understand the impact specific to your personal situation.





- Pilot: doubled utilization, but not 100%
- Long-term: investments with technology for a more student-centric approach.
- Hurdle: inertia; need commitment / prioritization from college
- Push: besides direct benefit to students and equity implications, let's look at ROI / cost of inaction




